The majority of Rwandan population are continuously using the mobile telephones as one of the platform to share information rather than fixed telephones. As a result, the mobile-cellular telephone subscriptions per 100 inhabitants recorded at the end of December 2018 were 82.1% while fixed telephone subscriptions per 100 inhabitants were 0.1%.

During this quarter under review, the number of mobile telephone subscriptions increased by 0.4% to reach 9,700,609 from 9,665,544 subscriptions recorded in the previous quarter.

At the end of 2018, the number of active mobile telephone subscriptions (90-days revenue generating subscribers) has increased by 10.0% up to 9,700,609 subscriptions compared to the last year. The same period recorded also an increase in the number of fixed telephone subscriptions up to 12,960 from 12,333 that were recorded at the end of December 2017.

The international average roaming subscribers during the fourth quarter of the year 2018 stood at 665,031 and 357,349 for incoming and outgoing subscriptions respectively.

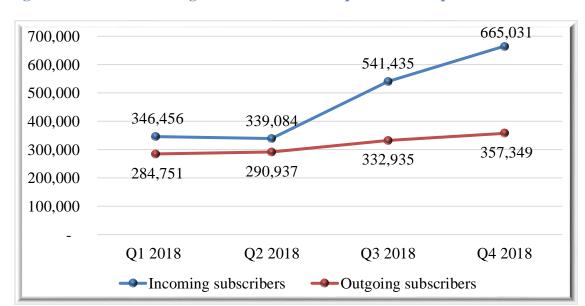
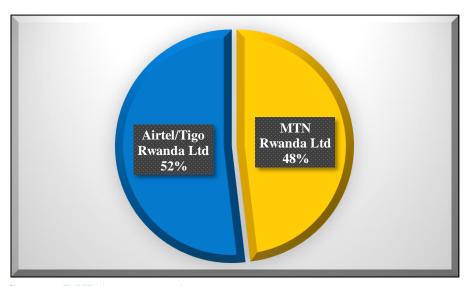


Figure 3: Trend of roaming subscribers from 1st quarter to 4th quarter 2018

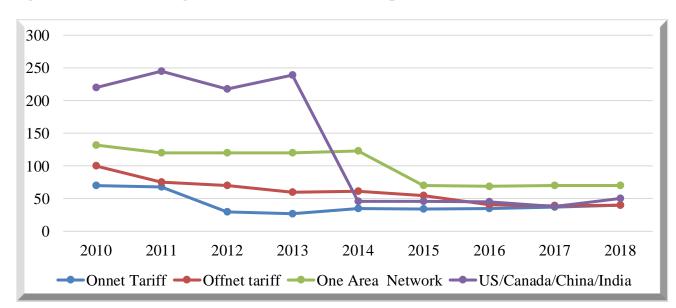


Figure 6: Trend of average mobile voice tariff (in Rwf) per minute from 2010 to 2018

As illustrated in Table 12, the total number of internet subscriptions stood at 6.1 million at the end of the fourth quarter 2018.

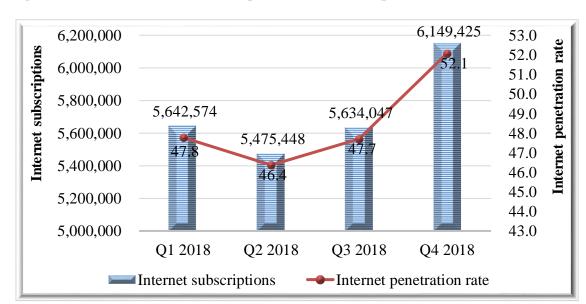


Figure 7: Trend of internet subscriptions and internet penetration from Q1 to Q4 2018

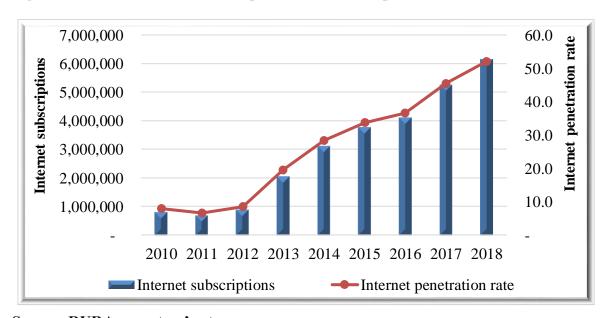


Figure 8: Trend of internet subscriptions and internet penetration from 2010 to 2018

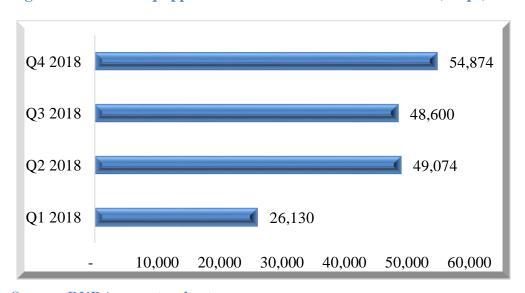

Figure 10: Standard mobile Internet tariff (Rwf/Mb) as of 31st December 2018

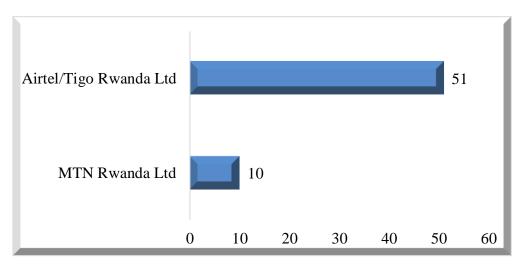
