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## I. PRELIMINARY REMARKS

The information compiled in this report is from Telecom companies, Internet Service Providers, Internet retailers, and Pay TV operators as per their license obligation. An active subscriber is defined as one that has generated revenue within three months of the quarter under review.

#### 1. MOBILE AND FIXED TELEPHONE SUBSCRIPTIONS

As of September 2018, the operators offering mobile telephone services included MTN Rwanda Ltd, Tigo Rwanda Ltd and Airtel Rwanda Ltd, and those offering fixed telephone services were Liquid Telecom Ltd, Airtel Rwanda Ltd, Tigo Rwanda Ltd and MTN Rwanda Ltd.



The majority of Rwandan population continuously adopted the use of mobile telephones as one of the technology platform to share information rather than fixed telephones. In this regard, mobile-cellular telephone subscriptions per 100 inhabitants recorded at the end of September 2018 were 81.85% while fixed telephone subscriptions per 100 inhabitants were 0.11%.

In this quarter under review, the mobile telephone subscriptions (90-days revenue generating subscribers) increased by 4.8% up to 9,665,544 subscriptions compared to the previous quarter. The same period recorded also an increase in the number of fixed telephone subscriptions up to 12,962 from 12,735 that were recorded at the end of June of the year 2018.



Figure 2: Trend of roaming subscribers from 1st quarter to 3rd quarter 2018



The number of roamers out and roamers in increased by 14.4% and 59.7% during this quarter under review to reach 332,935 and 541,435 subscriptions respectively from 290,937 and 339,084 subscriptions recorded during the last quarter.


Figure 3: Market share for mobile telephone subscribers per operator as of September 2018

In the third quarter of 2018, MTN Rwanda Ltd continued to show the biggest market share in mobile telephone subscriptions of 46% followed by Tigo Rwanda Ltd with 38% and Airtel Rwanda Ltd that has the market share of 16% in mobile telephone subscriptions.

As of the third quarter 2018, Tigo Rwanda Ltd had the largest market share of 73.5% for fixed telephone subscriptions, followed by MTN Rwanda Ltd with 21.5%, Liquid Telecom Ltd has 5.0% and Airtel Rwanda Ltd that has the insignificant market share of 0.1%.

#### 3. MOBILE MONEY SERVICES

Mobile technology continues to play a big role to enhance electronic payments. The mobile money platform transformed from a simple person-to-person money transfer service, to a platform through which an array of financial transactions can be executed. These services include withdrawal, transfers, deposit of cash to bank accounts, getting loans, tax payment, utility payment, purchase of goods and services, payment of school fees, etc.



As illustrated in Table 13, the total number of internet subscriptions stood at 5.63 million at the end of the third quarter 2018.




Figure 6: Trend of internet subscriptions and internet penetration from 2010 to Sep-2018

Figure 8: Standard mobile Internet tariff (Rwf/Mb) as of 30th September 2018


