

STATISTICS AND TARIFF INFORMATION IN TELECOM SECTOR AS OF DECEMBER 2015

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1. PRELIMINARY REMARKS

The information compiled in this report is from telecom companies, Internet Service Providers and 4G retailers.

Subscription in this context an "active subscriber" is defined as one that has generated revenue within three months of the quarter under review.

2. SUMMARY

This is a fourth quarter report for 2015; it covers the period from October to December 2015. This report includes information on mobile telephone, fixed telephone, internet, tariffs (voice call tariff, and data tariff), traffic, revenues, investment and employment in telecommunication sector.

In the period under review, the mobile telephone subscriptions increased from 8,510,950 recorded in the third quarter 2015 to 8,759,619 that was recorded in the fourth quarter 2015, this portrays a 3% increase. Mobile telephone penetration rate rose to 77.8% as compared to 75.49% recorded at the end of the previous quarter.

Fixed telephone subscriptions in this quarter fell by 62.8% from 45,619 recorded in the third quarter 2015 to 16,983 in this quarter under review. This decrease in fixed telephone subscribers is attributed to CDMA, and inactive telephones in Kigali and other parts of the country that have continued to be disconnected by Liquid telecom Ltd.

On internet data segment, the number of internet subscriptions as of December 2015 increased to 3,784,896 from 3,749,212 recorded in the third quarter. This represents an internet penetration rate of 33.5%.

3. MOBILE AND FIXED TELEPHONE SUBSCRIPTIONS

As of December 2015, operators offering mobile telephony services included MTN Rwanda Ltd, TIGO Rwanda Ltd and AIRTEL Rwanda Ltd, and those offering fixed telephone services were Liquid Telecom Ltd and MTN Rwanda Ltd.

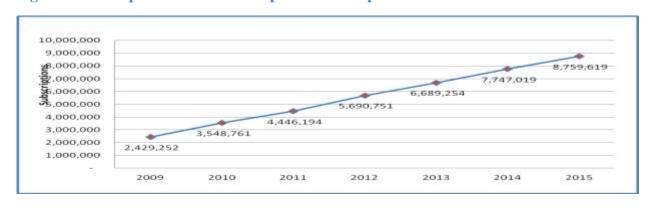

The number of fixed telephones subscriptions decreased from 45,619 recorded in the third quarter to 16,983 in the fourth quarter. This decrease is mainly due to CDMA and inactive fixed telephones disconnection and the widespread use of mobile telephones which are more convenient to use.

The annual increase in mobile telephone subscriptions is 13%, from 7,747,019 subscriptions in December 2014 to 8,759,619 that were recorded in December 2015. The increase is mainly attributed to Burundian refugees, promotional tariffs and calling packs and airtime, popularity of mobile based applications such as social media and financial applications, together with mobile network roll out.

The year 2015, recorded a decrease of 66% in fixed telephone subscribers where by the numbers decreased from 49, 612 connections in 2014 to 16,983 connections in 2015. The diffusion of mobile telephones has made people to shift from using fixed phones to mobile telephones. Secondly Liquid Telecom ltd, that has been the main operator in fixed telephones has disconnected inactive fixed telephones all over the country and the CDMA phones in up country.

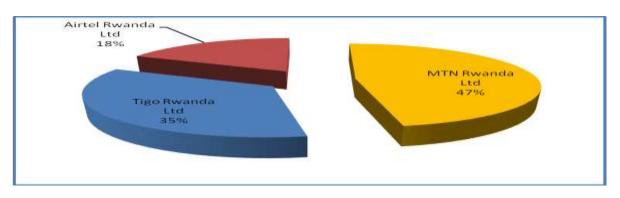

4. MARKET SHARE AND COVERAGE

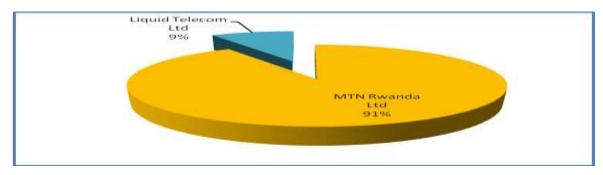
Figure 3: Mobile Telephone subscribers market share per operator as of the December 2015

MTN Rwanda Ltd continued to show the biggest market share in the third quarter 2015 of 47%, Tigo Rwanda followed with 35 % and Airtel Rwanda has the least market share of 18%.

The continued disconnection of fixed telephones by Liquid Telecom Ltd has moved it from being with the largest market to the least market share of 9%, and gave MTN Rwanda to have the largest market share in this segment with 91%.

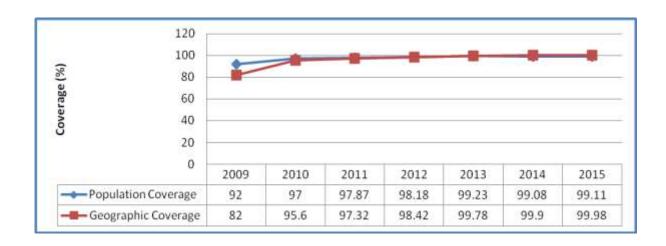

Geographically MTN 2G and 2.5 Network covers 99.11% of the total land area, followed by Airtel Rwanda Ltd with 92.02 % and 89.06% for TIGO Rwanda. This geographic network gives the opportunity to 99.91% of the population to access 2G and 2.5G networks of MTN Rwanda Ltd, 99.98% of TIGO Network and 93.45% of AIRTEL network.

3G and 3.5G mobile technologies were deployed geographically by MTN Rwanda Ltd at the level of 68.92%, Tigo Rwanda Ltd at 15.74%, and 17% for Airtel Rwanda Ltd as of December 2015.

Figure 6: Voice Tariff Trend (Frw per minute)

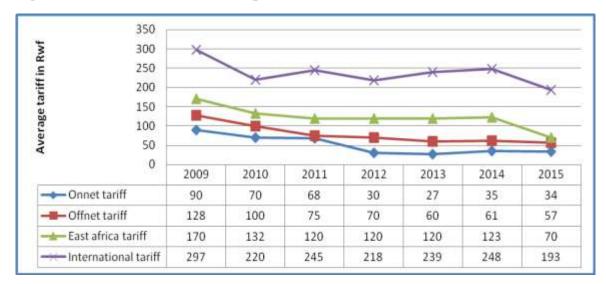

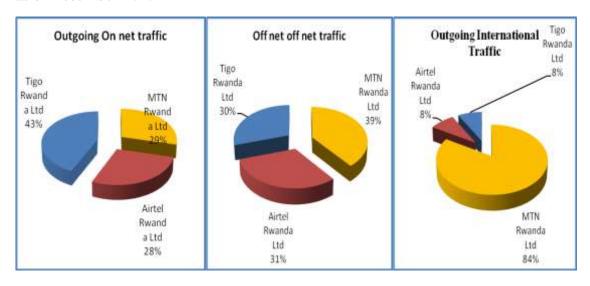

Figure 8: Trend in total internet Subscribers up to December 2015

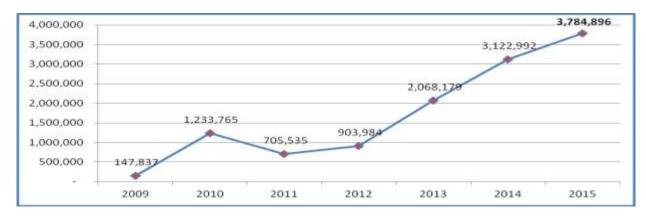
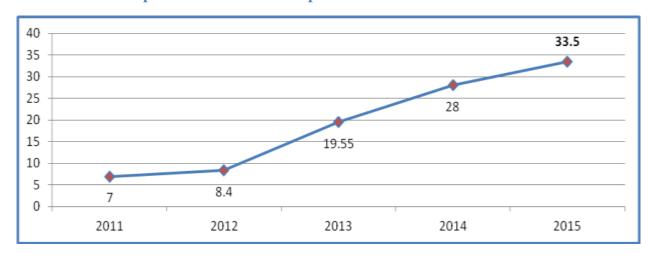


Table 12. Internet penetration rate trend up to December 2015

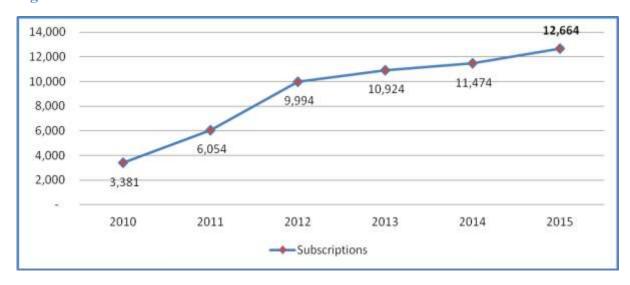

Figure 10: Standard mobile Internet tariff (Rwf/Mb) as of December 2015

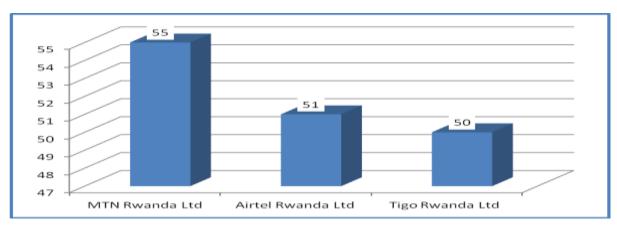
